While Amit Panghal of Mayna village in Rohatak district has been ranked World No. 1 in the 52-kg weight category by the International Boxing Association (AIBA), Manju Rani of Rihail village in the same district has got the World No. 2 rank in the 48-kg category. Amit Panghal has been ranked World No. 1 in 52-kg category while Manju Rani has bagged the World No. 2 spot in 48 kg. He is an Asian Games gold medalist and recently created history by becoming the first-ever Indian boxer to have won a silver medal at the AIBA World Boxing Championship.
