# Panipat factories top Yamuna polluters, those in city second

## Ensure Industries Reduce Discharge Of Effluents In River: CPCB To HSPCB

Gurgaon: A total of 413 industrial

industries dealing in textiles, oil and refinery, fertilisers, chemicals, and food and beverages operate in clusters in Gurgaon, Ballabgarh, Faridabad, Panipat and Sonapat. Since these factories use a huge quantity of chemicals for production, they end up generating effluents that are high in ammoniacal nitrogen and nitrates. In the absence of any treatment plants in most of these units, the polluting effluents end up in the Yamuna and increase its toxicity.

The CPCB survey inspected 924 gross polluting industries (GPI) across the state and tested their effluents. Of these, the samples of 413 industries were found to have high contents of ammoniacal nitrogen and nitrates.

The survey - which was carried

out between December 2021 and April 2022 - found that an ammoniacal nitrogen load of 277.4 kg/day and a nitrate load of 188.9 kg/day were being discharged into the nearby waterbodies through drains and tributaries. In the end, all such pollutants are finding their way into the Yamuna. The survey said.

At 45%, industries in Panipat were found to be discharging the highest quantity of pollutants. While Gurgaon was second on

the list, accounting for 25.2% of the discharges, Faridabad contributed 15.2%, Sonapat 10.1% and Bhiwani 2.3%.

In numbers, 191 of the polluting industries were identified in Panipat, 100 in Gurgaon, 32 in Faridabad and the remaining in Sonapat, Jhajjar and Rohtak. Among sectors, textile accounted for 84.2% of the polluting industries discharging effluents into the Yamuna.

The CPCB asked its Haryana

counterpart to ensure that all the identified industries curtailed the discharges of ammoniacal nitrogen, nitrate and phosphate and adopted a cleaner technology to treat waste.

Haryana pollution board officials, however, said they would act accordingly to reduce the effluents into the Yamuna. "Haryana has many unauthorised units. There is hardly any action on such units," said Varun Gulati, a Delhi-based activist.

the Yamuna also increased last year. Faecal coliform is found in excreta that contaminates water through untreated sewage. This depicts that untreated sewage continues to flow in the river.

The level of dissolved oxygen (DO), which is a marker of presence of life in the river, remained nil and biochemical oxygen demand (BOD) also increased. BOD is the minimum oxygen required for a river to decompose organic matter. Compared with the ideal range of 3-5 units, it was 80 units in January and 73 in December.

The worst pollution in the river occurred between Wazirabad and ISBT Bridge. By the time the river reached the city's exit point in Asgarpur, the

pollution level had risen exponentially. While the river showed a slight improvement in the limit and at least 272 times higher than the standards.

The river, while entering the city had DO hovering between 1 and 10, BOD around two units and the faecal coliform level around 1,000 to 1400 units - all within limits. After the river crossed ISBT Bridge, DO became nil, BOD increased from 2-3 units to around 50 units, and the faecal coliform level increased by over 2,00,000 units. By the time the river reached Asgarpur, the faecal coliform level and BOD doubled while DO became nil.

Recently National Green Tribunal had expressed its dissatisfaction with the work done so far to control pollution in the river. It also formed a new committee under LG.

# Frauds on prowl, cops to start awareness drive for foreigners

Gurgaon: Police have decided to distribute pamphlets to create awareness among foreigners who come to the city for medical treatment. The move comes after several people filed complaints alleging that con men posing as cops have robbed several foreigners, who came to the city for medical treatment and were residing in hotels and guest houses near the hospital.

Two days ago, two foreign nationals from Kenya were duped of ₹1,800 after three men impersonating as policemen intercepted their way near Artemis hospital and started checking them. When they left, the foreign nationals realised that their money had been stolen and they informed the police control room about the incident.

The security chief and marketing chiefs of the hospitals will be briefed that foreign nationals should be provided a locker service in the hospitals. The picture of the vehicle used to carry the foreign nationals to the hospital or vice-versa should be with security guards at the hospital. The police said that the cases of foreign nationals being duped by criminals impersonating officers have increased manifold. The police said that they will be instructing the hospitals to increase CCTV cameras affixed on all the entry gates of the hospital.

The police said they will also give pamphlets to the guest houses where foreign nationals stay so that they are also aware of such instances. In addition, an inspector will always be in a foreign national who never leaves her or she goes for the medical check up.
